



DATA PROTECTION FEE

Updated: October 2020

The General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) came into effect on 25th May 2018. From this date, organisations are required to pay an annual Data Protection Fee to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO).

The Data Protection Fee is a tiered system of payment dependent upon an organisation's turnover or number of members of staff. However, there are exemptions to payment and organisations are encouraged to review the ICO guidance on exemptions in order to determine payment status.
