

Appendix A: COMPETITIONS WORKING PARTY (CWP)

We received considerable interest from players and administrators who wished to join the CWP. The final group was formed of a cross section of our community – players/umpires and administrators – with representation across the regions, age groups and gender.

The group was chaired by Margaret Docherty, Director of Competitive Events, with officer support from Alistair Hollis (Head of Sport Development) and Lee Rowland (Sport Operations Officer).

Each member of the CWP brought relevant experience, both through their involvement with the sport at various levels and their professional background. The CWP was accountable to the Bowls England Board.

Appendix B: SUMMARY OF RESEARCH FINDINGS

2020 Participant Survey

- U45s and 45-54 years old play competitively to a much higher degree, while social bowls increases with age
- 57% are members of a club to enable them play in competitions, especially in the younger age group
- Overall feedback on the current competition structure is positive, with participants competing in multiple competitions and formats
- Attitudes to these elements should also be tested with those who do not currently compete, to ensure that they do not pose any barriers to those not currently involved, as overall 36% would welcome a more flexible approach to competitive bowls and 30% would welcome shorter formats
- Social bowlers are less satisfied that the playing options available to them are compatible with their lifestyles
- Pairs and Triples are the most popular National Championship events
- Mixed Pairs and Senior Pairs are the most popular National Competition events
- 35% of competition players have qualified for the National Finals during their career
- 43% are happy about the amount they play, however family commitments, time and work commitments are the biggest barrier to additional participation
- Work and family commitments are cited as the two reasons why people have elected to stop playing in competitions (or never to have entered)



Non-Participant Survey

- Of those interested in taking up bowls, 67% wish to play once a week or less, 89% want to play for no more than two hours at a time and on average people would be willing to pay £5 per session
- The three biggest barriers to participation in sport are time, work commitments and family commitments
- Of those who considered playing, not having anyone to play with was the main reason for not taking it up

2020 Club Survey

- 90% of our clubs class themselves as 'social and competitive'
- 77% are proud when competitive members achieve success
- 30% feel that competitions generate much-needed income
- 38% of clubs run competitions specifically for new players
- 70% of clubs and/or their members participate in Bowls England events
- Of those who do not participate, lack of interest amongst members was the single biggest reason for non-participation
- There is significant support for the wider use of technology to assist club management

2021 Competitions Player Survey

- 50% of respondents were aged 65 and over
- 72% of respondents were male
- Of those who participated in four or less events, time was the single biggest reason for non-participation
- Local/regional events would encourage more `non-entrants' to enter national events in the future
- 20% of competitive bowlers play more than 15 hours per week
- 2-3 hours was the optimal length of game (64%) and 3-4 hours including travel
- Weekday evenings are the preferred time to participate (48%)
- 75% of entrants supported the introduction of more events (county/regional) where several rounds could be played on a single day
- 33% of entrants felt that fewer national competitions should be concluded at the National Finals, whilst 30% felt that qualifiers at national Finals should be reduced
- 78% of respondents were interested in regional events that did not lead to national finals
- 43% of respondents were opposed to players changing position during a match
- 65% were opposed to international players being prevented from participating in some domestic events
- 52% supported the idea that some events could be played during weekdays (daytime)



RESEARCH FROM OTHER NATIONAL BOWLS ASSOCIATIONS

Bowls Australia

- Bowls Australia stage a number of coveted national events across the width and breadth of the country each year
- The Australian Open is a mass-participation event, featuring more than 2000 competitors vying for more than \$275,000 in prize-money, and is played across 14 days of action at 13 clubs across the Gold Coast region
- The Bowls Premier League is the sport's made-for-television product, which boasts 20 hours of live broadcast coverage on Fox Sports Australia and Sky Sport NZ with each edition, and sees eight teams compete for \$100,000 prize-money
- The BPL Cup provides an opportunity for Club-based teams to progress through various rounds to National Finals, to be played in parallel with the Bowls Premier League in November each year
- The Nationals is a collection of national events, played across a two week period.
 The included events are Under 18 Championships, Sides Championships, Para
 Championships, Champion of Champions and Australian Championships detail below:
 - The Australian Sides Championships features 192 of the country's best bowlers all representing their respective States and Territories in the test to determine the winners of the coveted men's Alley Shield, women's Marj Morris Trophy and Overall State Champions Trophy.
 - The Australian Under-18 Championships is the sport's only junior national event, and comprises of five girls and five boys from every state and territory.
 - The Australian Senior Sides Championships is a state-based over-60s event, in a round robin format featuring three-rinks of four players in each gender to make up a master-scorecard.
 - The Australian Champion of Champions is a singles-only event, featuring each state and territory's reigning champion of champion winner in a test to determine the country's most consistent singles exponents, who are then afforded entry into the following year's World Champion of Champions event.
 - The Australian Championships pits the winners of every State/Territory Championships against each other, in an effort to find the sport's best singles, pairs, triples and fours combinations in both the men and women's events.
 - The Australian Para Championships pits the winners of State/Territory Para Championships against each other, in an effort to find the sport's best bowlers across various disciplines and classifications in both the men's and women's events.

Bowls Canada

- Bowls Canada has announced a new-look competition schedule introduced for 2024 following review. Details at: https://bowlscanada.com/en/2024-canadian-championships/
- The national Championship format is moving from a series of individual championships spread out across several months and geographic regions to a single prestigious Canadian Lawn Bowling Championships hosted over six days.
- The following disciplines (events) will be played Canadian Championship:



- o Men's Singles, Fours, Pairs, Triples in a five aside format
- o Women's Singles, Fours, Pairs, Triples in a five aside format
- Youth U21 singles and pairs
- Para Bowls events across B1 to B8 classifications for bowlers with disabilities
- For the five-a-side format, each team member plays two events: singles or fours and pairs or triples.
- The Mixed Pairs has been removed at the national level largely due to the need to keep the event contained. Bowls Canada recognises that this format is extremely popular with recreational bowlers and hopes there will be more events at regional level.

Bowls New Zealand

 - Knockout format
 - Participation in multiple events restricted to avoid clashes
- Additional events:

PLAYER SURVEY 2023

Finally, to assist with the final recommendations, a Player Survey was conducted following the 2023 National Finals. The survey was completed by a total of 2,096 respondents, with a very good spread of player types and statistically significant sample size:

- County level player or participating in inter-county events 944
- Competition bowler (not current) 546
- Social competition bowler 426
- Did not say 101
- Current England Player 47
- U18/U25 International 32

Key findings are shown within this section:

Competition Programme

Results within these section only include those who participated in National Championships and National Competitions in 2023

- The Two-Bowl Singles Championship is the least valued of all events with 39% rating it as 'least value'
- All other Championship events were very highly valued
 - o Pairs 82%
 - o Triples 78%
 - o Fours 73%
 - Singles 68%
- The most highly valued National Competitions were
 - o Top Club 52%
 - Club Two Fours 39%
- 47% of respondents agreed that there should be better definition of competitions in order for them to be more relevant by age and/or ability (only 22% disagreed)

Non-participants in any domestic Bowls England competitions in 2023

A total of 653 respondents indicated that they had not participant in any national competitions in 2023.

- The three top reasons for not participating were:
 - I don't feel I'm good enough 34%
 - Playing doesn't sound enjoyable or fun 16%
 - I do not want to travel longer distances to play 15%
- The top three motivations to participate in competitions in the future were:
 - Local and/or regional events on a single day/weekend 38%
 - The opportunity to play against players of similar ability 37%
 - The opportunity to play with more experienced players 21%
- The top three types of competition that would attract non-participants were:



- Representing club 42%
- A more relaxed new format 27%
- Age group events 23%
- The top three responses for who non-participants would most wish to play with were:
 - With club mate/s of same gender 57%
 - With club mate/s of a different gender 39%
 - o On own 30%
- The two most popular times for non-participants to play were:
 - Weekday afternoon 35%
 - Weekday evening 28%

Age Groups

- 44% of all respondents agreed that grouping players of a similar age/ability will provide fair and healthy competition (35% disagreed)
 - Those in the younger age categories did not support but there was growing support from those aged 60 and over
- 35% of all respondents agreed that grouping players with similar age and ability will support players on the pathway to future success (29% disagreed)
 - Again those in the younger age groups were less likely to support this statement
- 35% of all respondents agreed that current age bands do not meet the objectives of age group competition (21% disagreed)
 - o Those aged 70 and over were lost likely to agree with this statement
- 34% of all respondents agreed that there is too much overlap between age group competition and open [open to any age] competition (23% disagreed)
 - o Those aged over 60 were most likely to agree with this statement
- 77% of all respondents felt that age bands for men and women should be consistent (7% disagreed)
- 55% of respondents felt that under 25 was 'about right' for junior events
- 49% of respondents felt that over 55 was 'too low' for senior events, with 46% thinking it was 'about right'
- 81% of respondents felt that players should be permitted to enter open and junior events
- 85% of respondents felt that players should be permitted to enter open and senior events
- 42% of respondents supported the introduction of more age bands for junior competition to support their individual development and talent identification
- A majority (51%) were against the introduction of more age bands for senior events
- 63% of respondents felt that If the number of age group competitions were increased should people be able to play in multiple categories

National Finals

- Greater visibility is needed to profile the best our sport can offer 88% agree
- National finals are valued by all bowlers not just those who qualify and their families – 66% agree

Qualification

• Qualification for national finals motivates me to enter – 63% agree



- Whilst this pattern is similar across the regions and gender, significantly more of those aged over 70 years and 'social bowlers' are likely to not have an opinion either way
- Regional qualification would resolve the problem of national championships qualifiers playing a number of different rounds dependent on the size of their county – 44% agreed and a further 25% had no opinion either way
- Qualification places allocated as a percentage of the whole number of qualification places will resolve qualifiers playing a number of different rounds dependent on the size of the county – 42% agree and 34% neither agreed nor disagreed
- I would still enter national competitions even if there were fewer qualifiers for the national finals 46% agreed with this statement and 22% neither agreed nor disagreed. Men were more likely to disagree, whilst social bowlers and those aged over 70 where more likely to have no opinion

Scheduling of Competitions - consistent

- I believe the national finals should focus primarily on the national championship Blue Riband events 40% agreed, with 37% disagreed
- I believe players should be permitted to participate in national finals in all rounds of the Blue Riband events for which they qualify 80% agree
- I believe the national finals should celebrate the inclusivity of our sport with the appropriate representation of age, gender and ability 80% agree
- I believe that duplications and clashes should be avoided by limiting qualification places – 51% disagreed
- I believe that duplication and clashes should be avoided by reducing the number of events that are open to all at the point of entry – 55% disagreed
- I would prefer not to play more than two matches per day in any single event –
 57% agreed
- I would support the finals of some competitions being held outside the national finals to reduce duplications 45% agreed/40% disagreed
- I believe qualification numbers should be maximised 60% agreed
- I believe all competitions should conclude during the national finals 73% agreed

Game formats

- Formats in Blue Riband events should replicate those at international level to help provide a pathway, and make for consistency for fans 53% agree
 - This response is not in line with previous feedback from players and counties over the last few years, which has strongly resisted format changes
 - Results skewed by a high number of social bowlers, who are not the target market for these events, being highly in favour of such a change
 - o A majority of current international players did not support this
- Matches should be made shorter in some events to provide opportunities for people with less time to play in competitions – 59% disagreed
- All rounds of a single event (qualifying rounds and final stages) should follow the same format – 90% agree
- I would support the introduction of more events (County/Regional)where several rounds are played on a single day – 35% agreed and a further 21% had no opinion either way
- I would support the introduction of events that encourages new people to play in competitions 82% agree
- I would participate in open events that do not lead to national finals 51% agree



- I would support an event where substitutes can be introduced during the match –
 50% disagree
 - The largest group objecting to this are current county bowlers those classed as social bowlers, competition bowlers and junior bowlers were in support
- I would support an event where players can change position during the match –
 48% agree
 - There were some stark regional differences in response to this question, with players in the East, Midlands and North where Federation Bowls permits the change of position all in favour of such a change
- I would support the introduction of set dates to play in some national competitions 65% agree
- I would support the introduction of events that can be played during weekdays (daytime) – 48% agree
 - The introduction of daytime events were particularly supported by those aged 60 and over; those in the younger age categories not in support of daytime play
- I would support the introduction of a national league (played regionally in early stages) 57% agree

Player Experience

- I would support a single point of entry for the national championships and national competitions (for example via an on-line registration process) – 67% agree
- I would support the development of an on-line competitions management for all national championships (including county rounds) and national competitions – 69% agree
- I would support the development of a standardised calendar for SOME national competitions with set-dates rather than play-by dates 61% agree
- I believe the national championships and national competitions programme should be promoted together 78% agree
- I would like to see the use of more technology across the sport in the management of competitions 77% agree






Q21 Thinking about the qualifications for national finals, to what extent do yo agree or disagree with the following statements:

(a) Having a qualification for national finals motivates me to enter. 63% agree with this statement (44% strongly 19% slightly) 26% neither agree nor disagree.

















(b) The increase in the number of qualifiers through inclusion of national competitions over the year has diluted the achievement of reaching the national finals.


